- As of August 1, 2009 Intercultural Homestays and Services, Inc. (IHS) will provide SPU Homestay. Please use the included IHS application if you need homestay.
- Dormitory and campus apartment fees are approximate. Fees are based on the meal plan for 5 days per week and double occupancy. Students will pay dormitory costs after arrival. Dormitory and campus apartments dormitory may be available in June, July and August, but cannot be guaranteed. Fee will be set when and if dormitory is available.
- All students are required to have valid health insurance. Students must demonstrate health insurance coverage or purchase health insurance through A.C.E. Fees listed above cover the student during the 5-week session. Students may purchase additional coverage for vacation periods.

Application Fee

\$100 Application fee

The Application fee is required at the time of application and is non-refundable.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

Payment is due on the first day of classes. Students may request a refund of refundable fees before the first day of classes for that session. There is a \$250 cancellation fee applied for all cancellations regardless of the number of prepaid sessions. There are no refunds for the session once it has begun. Students or a representative must complete a Cancellation and Refund Form to request a refund. Please see Terms and Conditions for more details.

Financial Documentation for F-1 Visa Students

The United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) requires that students have sufficient financial resources to meet school and living costs while in the U.S. The student, parents, or a sponsor must provide a current bank statement or an official letter from a bank verifying sufficient funds. At least \$3,000 per month is deemed sufficient.

Courier Mailing Fee

Students may request to have acceptance materials and I-20 sent by courier mail service. There will be an additional charge of \$65 for courier mail service. All applications received less than 30 days before the student's requested start date will automatically be sent by courier mail service.

Airport Pick-up and Drop-off Fees

A \$100 fee will be charged if A.C.E. provides airport transportation:

Other Expenses

Students should expect to buy books at a cost of \$50-\$150 per session. Students should budget additional money for personal expenses such as travel or entertainment. These expenses will vary.

Payment of Fees

A.C.E. will accept payment by traveler's check, personal check drawn on a U.S. bank, cashier's check, credit card (Visa or MasterCard), or wire transfer. To pay by wire transfer you must add a \$30 wire transfer fee to the amount invoiced.

Age Requirement

Students aged 17 and older may enroll in an A.C.E. Language Institute.

What is the Flex Program?

The Flex program is offered throughout the academic year. It includes either 2 hours of Reading and Writing or 2 hours of Listening and Speaking. It also includes 1 hour of Group Conversation and 1 hour of Private Tutoring. That's 20 hours per week of intensive, specialized study!

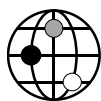

General Program Information – Terms and Conditions

A.C.E. Language Institutes: Intensive English Program

1. Enrollment

New students must send us: 1) A completed A.C.E. application form 2) Non-refundable application fee 3) Proof of financial certification (see # 2) and 4) Copy of student's passport. Continuing students complete the Enrollment Agreement at the end of each session.

2. Financial Certification

The U.S. government requires that students have sufficient financial resources to meet school and living costs while in the U.S. The student, parents, or sponsor must provide a current bank statement or an official letter from a bank verifying sufficient funds (about \$3,000 per month).

3. Acceptance

When you have been accepted, we will send you a Welcome Packet with your acceptance letter, an I-20 form (if needed), and information about the school, USA, travel, health insurance and billing. Students then apply at the nearest U.S. consulate or embassy for an F-1 student visa.

4. Age Requirement

Only students 17 or older may enroll in courses. Those ages 10-16 may be eligible on a case-by-case basis.

5. Airport Arrival Service

If requested for an additional fee, an A.C.E. representative or driver will meet you at the nearest airport and help you get to your home.

6. Housing

Depending on the location, A.C.E. can arrange housing with an American host family, in a campus dormitory or campus apartment. Campus apartments accept only married or graduate students and are not always immediately available. Please return the complete Housing Form and the housing placement fee to A.C.E. at least 4 weeks before arrival. Students may also make their own arrangements. Students are responsible for all damages or other charges incurred at their home.

7. Placement Testing

After arrival, students take a test to determine their level of study. Instructors may sometimes recommend changes in level placement during the first week of the course. Students who arrange for individual testing may be charged a fee.

8. Administrative Time

Up to 10% of each session may be related to registration, orientation, placement testing, student evaluation, or program ceremonies.

9. Course Changes

A.C.E. reserves the right to cancel courses on short notice due to insufficient enrollment. If this happens, students will be offered a substitute course of the same length, sometimes in combination with other levels of study.

10. Student Attendance

Students are expected to attend classes full time. Students who attend less than 80% of classes may fail a level and/or endanger their visa status. Excessive lateness is not acceptable. Teachers will explain the attendance policy at the beginning of each session.

11. Certificate and Grades

Students who successfully complete course requirements will receive a course certificate. Students will also receive a transcript of grades at the end of their course of study, upon request. Students who successfully complete Level 6 will receive a Certificate of Graduation and full recommendation to university study. Students who wish to review their files may do so by scheduling an appointment with the program director. Student records are maintained as confidential according to the release of information waiver on the application form.

12. Behavioral Expectations and Program Advancement

Students enrolled in the program must follow A.C.E. and campus rules. Students must maintain an 80% attendance record and must maintain good academic progress by passing each level within two attempts. Violations of attendance, academic, or discrimination and harassment policies will lead to corrective action, which may include probation, suspension or dismissal. In the case of dismissal, no refunds are given (see # 18). Students who resolve probationary violations by the end of the following two sessions will be removed from probationary status.

13. Payment

The required \$100 program application fee is due with the completed application form. Course tuition and all other fees are due on or before the first day of each session. Students may pay by personal check, travelers' check, bank wire transfer, credit card, (MasterCard, or Visa only). All checks should be made payable to the A.C.E. Language Institute. Students who pay late may incur a late fee. Any checks that bounce will also incur a \$20 fee.

14. Cancellation and Refund

"Cancellation" means informing A.C.E. in writing before the first day of classes of a given prepaid session that the student will not attend. No refunds are offered after the session has started. There is a \$250 cancellation fee applied for all cancellations regardless of the number of prepaid sessions. However, all sessions' tuition and refundable charges will be refunded if cancelled before the start of the session. Students must submit a completed Cancellation and Refund Form to A.C.E. No refunds are issued if a student is dismissed for disciplinary reasons. No refunds are issued for application or housing placement fees. Portions of requested refunds may be issued to agency organizations that the student selected. Refunds can also be applied to tuition and fees in future sessions by student request. Should there be any change to the cancellation and refund policy, the policy that was in place at the time of the student's prepayment shall be maintained until the end of the prepaid term.

15. Withdrawal from the Course

"Withdrawal" means to stop taking classes after the course has begun. Given the length of the A.C.E. session no refunds are issued for the current session once classes have begun. If a student has prepaid for future sessions, a refund will be issued in accordance with the Cancellation and Refund Policy stated in item #14 of the General Program Information. Students who experience a family emergency and must return home on short notice may request special consideration from the program director.

16. Program Changes

Fees may be incurred for a change in program after the start date of a given session. A program change includes changes between intensive and Flex (at SPU) and/or a change between full-time and part-time study.

17. Health Insurance

All students must have health insurance. Students may purchase insurance in their country and bring proof of policy with them. Students who arrive without proof of health insurance valid in the U.S. are required to purchase it from an A.C.E. provider.

18. Dignity Statement

A.C.E. seeks to provide a learning environment in which all individuals can achieve success. With equality as our guiding principle, discrimination and harassment by any employee, student, visitor, or agent of A.C.E. will not be tolerated in any form. Discrimination consists of prejudicial actions or statements based on another's race, ethnic background, age, religion, gender or sexual orientation. Violations of this policy will lead to corrective discipline, which may include suspension and/or dismissal.

19. Complaint Procedures

If a student has a problem with classes, housing policies or fees, he or she should speak first with the A.C.E. staff who is responsible for that area. If the problem is still not resolved, the student may speak with the program director or organizational executive. Contact information is available at the program center.

20. Limited Liability

Neither A.C.E. nor its representatives will be liable in any way to the student in cases where A.C.E. is unable to fulfill any services to which they are bound by contract because of labor disputes, weather conditions, or other cause outside the control of A.C.E. Neither will A.C.E. be liable for damage, loss, illness, or injury to person or property regardless of cause, except in cases where liability is imposed beyond exclusion by statute.
